- Finance Director Hales. Ms. Hales mentioned that her report was included in the packet and offered to answer any questions.
- Village Manager Dupee. Mr. Dupee mentioned that his report and his superintendents reports were included in the packet. He reported a correction to his report concerning the Barker St. CSX crossing closure would be moved back from December 6th. to December 9th.
- Public Participation None
- Main Street Wellington. Mayor Schneider reported for Ms. Arntz; she thanked everyone for shopping on Small Business Saturday, and estimated approximately 230 people came out to shop. She thanked the volunteers, especially Pat Bolt who made the event a success. There will be a B2B mixer on Tuesday Dec. 5th at the Elms Retirement Village. The annual membership meeting is January 9th from 7. 8:30 PM at the Elms Retirement Village, B2B mixer on January 11th from 3. 5 PM at H&R Block, and on January 27th from Noon. 4 PM at Forts Tavern, Lets Wine About Winter, and at the Red Iron Grill, Beat the Boredom with Beer. The 2018 membership drive is underway, Vanya Hales is the newest member! There was some discussion about the Nord Center Grants. Mr. Bughman mentioned that the merchants were thrilled with the attendance of the Small Business Saturday event.

7. REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

- Finance. Ms. Denes reported that the committee will meet at 5PM on December 18th to continue the discussion of the 2018 budget, which will be passed as an emergency at the council meeting.
- Police. Mr. Wells mentioned that the committee met prior to council and discussed a parking complaint, employee retention, and the lack of space in the Police Station for basic office functions. He reported that Chief Barfield distributed a hand out concerning Police compensation. The committee recommends to council, that they adopt a proposed tiered pay system for the Wellington Police Dept., that is embodied in the hand out from Chief Barfield, as well as a 5% differential in the pay levels of the supervisors in the dept. The committee is also recommending to council the addition of one full time officer to replace a current part time officer, not for any action tonight, however the committee feels they are important things to try to do in the 2018 budget. Mr. Wells reported that two recent hires are completing their probationary period; Motion by Wells, 2nd by Denes to remove Steve Kiness from probation and increase his wage from \$17.88 per hour to \$18.77 per hour, effective the next full pay. Roll call vote was taken with all members voting %es+ Motion by Wells, 2nd by Hartman to remove Ryan McClellan from probation and increase his wage from \$15.90 per hour to \$16.70 per hour, effective the next full pay. Roll call vote was taken with all members voting %es+.
- Public Works. Ms. Dronsfield mentioned that the committee meeting had been cancelled, and will meet in January.
