- Chief Barfield. Chief Barfield thanked the village residents for moving their vehicles from the streets, during the snow bans. Ms. Dronsfield congratulated Chief Barfield and his department for placing 4th out of 26 in the chili cook-off.
- Finance Director Hales. Ms. Hales mentioned that council had her report and she offered to answer any questions.
- Village Manager Dupee. Mr. Dupee mentioned that his report and those of the department heads were included in the packet, and he had nothing further to add.

- Main Street Wellington. Ms. Arntz reminded residents to attend Beat the Winter Blues with Brews, and Lets Wine About Winter on Saturday from Noon to 4:00 PM. She mentioned that she had tickets for the Kiwanis Pancake Day. Ms. Arntz reported on pre-diabetes in her THRIVE healthy minute report.

- Finance. Mr. Hartman reported that the committee met prior to council and discussed the property and casualty insurance renewal proposal from Wichert Ins. He mentioned that the premium would cost the village \$112,525.00.
- Police. Mr. Wells mentioned that the committee met prior to the council meeting and discussed the yearly report at length. Motion by Wells, 2nd by Dronsfield to remove Ethan Chaperlo from probation and increase his wage to \$16.33 per hour, effective the next pay period. Roll call vote was taken with all members voting %es+ Motion by Wells, 2nd by Dronsfield to remove special officers, Steve Zacharias and Garrett Longacre from probation. He reported that special officers, receive no pay, and thanked the officers for their work.

- Public Works. Ms. Dronsfield mentioned that the committee met prior to council and discussed miscellaneous updates including snow removal, vehicle maintenance, and a dirt grader/ballfield groomer constructed by Bob Brasee at a cost of \$4,000.00. Ms. Dronsfield reported that Republic Services will pick up all trash, including bulk pick-up this week.
- Utility. Mr. Rowland mentioned that the committee will meet prior to council on Feb. 19th. He reported that the CIC met on January 28th and approved the sale of 1 acre of land to SoFarr Inc., a small tool and die shop, owned by Wellington resident Kurt Farr.
