Roll call vote was taken with all members voting "yes". Motion by Hartman, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Wells to authorize a 3% increase for 2020, for all non-tier, non-probationary employees, effective the first full pay in April. Roll call vote was taken with all members voting "yes". Motion by Hartman, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Rowland to

suspend disconnection service requirements set forth in chapter 933.03 until May 15<sup>th</sup> 2020. Roll call vote was taken with all members voting "yes". Motion by Hartman, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Bughman to waive late fee requirements set forth in chapter 933.02 for utility bills rendered on April 1<sup>st</sup> 2020. Roll call vote was taken with all members voting "yes".
