## 5. COMMUNICATIONS FROM MAYOR, COUNCIL, AND VILLAGE OFFICIALS

- Finance Director Pfeiffer Absent
- Village Manager Greever Mr. Greever mentioned that he would stand on his report. Mr. Hartman thanked Mr. Greever for all of his hard work, and appreciated all of the answers he provided in the committee meetings.
- Main Street Wellington MSW Director Arntz reported on upcoming events, including Shop Hop and Nibble, Night at the Races, the Gazebo Garden Walk, and downtown cleanup on May 17. She reported that Main Street made around \$6,000 at its Designer Purse Raffle, and thanked everyone for their support.

#### 6. REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

- Finance Mr. Hartman reported that the committee will meet on April 21, prior to council.
- Police Mr. Rowland reported that the committee will meet on April 21, prior to council. He mentioned
  that the Housing Council ordinance and minutes were included in the packet. He further mentioned that it
  was a great tax abatement program, with US Screen being the only business participating at this time.
- Public Works Ms. Dronsfield explained to the government students in attendance, the responsibilities of the Public Works Dept. She reported that the Village does not collect leaves in the spring, and advised residents to bag their leaves and dump them at Public Works. She mentioned that the Village is looking to install cameras at the Rec Park sometime soon.
- Utility Mr. Bughman reported that the committee met prior to council and heard that the AMI electric meters were 100% installed, and 70% of the water meters had been installed. Motion by Bughman, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Hartman to re-hire Ralph Wright as seasonal mower, at \$15.50 per hour, effective April 14, and re-hire Ethan Metheney as seasonal summer employee for the Wastewater Treatment Plant, at \$12.00 per hour, effective May 5. Roll call vote was taken with all members voting "yes".

- Ordinance Mr. Feron reported that the committee met prior to council and discussed downtown parking, reworking issues and considering hiring a magistrate. He further reported that the committee will meet on May 5 prior to council. Cemetery Board Mr. Feron reminded residents to remove all items from the gravesites by April 15 for cleanup. He reported that May 5 is the high school community service day, and the high school students do a great job with the cleanup.
- Personnel Mr. Boham reported that the committee met prior to council in executive session. No decisions were made.
