Severe exposure and spread. Only leave home for supplies and services. Follow all current health orders.




During the past three weeks, **Lorain County's** COVID-19 cases have increased. Lorain County has had more than 160 cases during the past 14 days. Cases more than doubled from an average of 5.5 cases on June 16 to 14 cases on June 29. The community is also experiencing early signs that more people are seeking medical care for COVID-19 symptoms. From June 16 to June 30, visits for COVID-19 to the emergency department doubled from an average of 3 per day to 6 per day. More people are also visiting their doctors and being diagnosed with COVID-19. From June 16 to July 2, outpatient visits more than tripled from an average of 8 visits per day to 26. In recent weeks, more than 91% of the cases are not in congregate settings, signaling significant transmission in the broader community. Recent community outbreaks include settings such as workplaces, a child care center, and a faith-based organization.

New Cases: Past 28 Days





7-Day Average of New Cases


