


This survey allows the Village of Wellington water customers to determine the material of their water service lines. The results of the survey are dependent on the accuracy of the data filled out and are not guaranteed by the Village of Wellington. Filling out this survey will allow the Village of Wellington to submit the required service line inventory to the EPA, save staff time, minimize their entry into homes, and keep costs lower. This data will be used to satisfy the U.S. EPA's lead and copper rule revisions, which became effective in December 2021. One of the requirements of this revision is that all water utilities record the material of the customer water service lines. Filling out this survey will allow the Village of Wellington to submit the required service line inventory to the EPA.

To complete this survey, you will need a coin, a key or another tool, and a magnet.

## Question 1: Locate the water service line coming into your home/building.

The service line comes into your home or building from the street. It is typically located in your basement, utility room on the lowest level of the building or in a crawl space. The service line will be connected to the water meter, if you have one. Identify a test area on the pipe between the point where it enters the building and your shutoff valve or water meter. If the pipe is covered or wrapped, expose a small area of metal.
